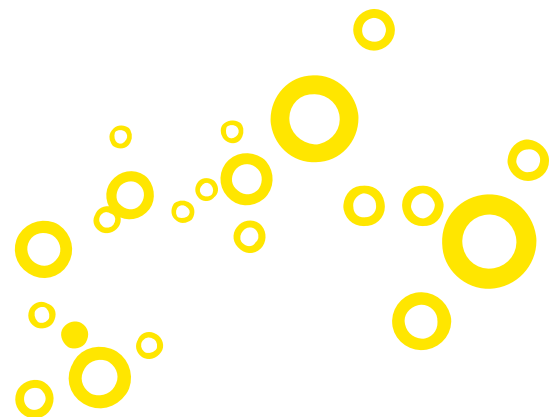

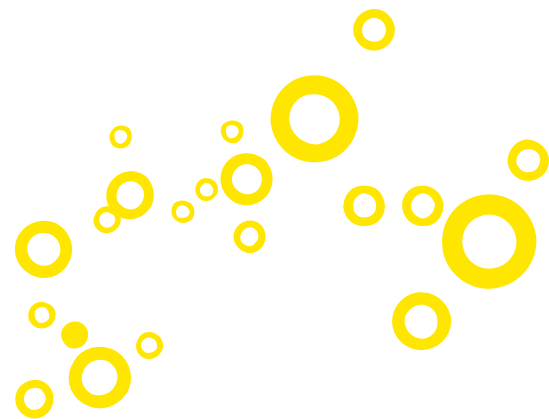

Speakers and Workshops

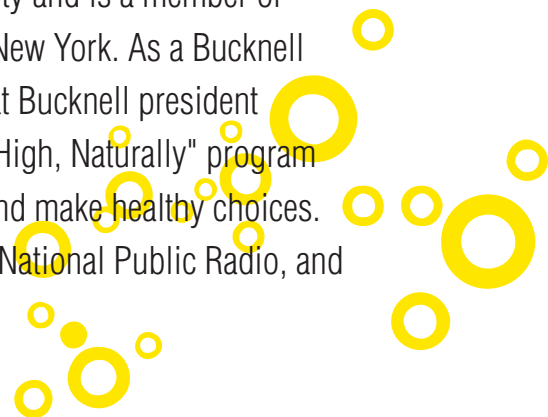
Speakers

We're planning an educational experience that will motivate and enlighten students and adults alike. These are a few of our speakers for the 2008 SADD National Conference. Check back for updates about others who will join us!

Josh Shipp can be found dispensing his own brand of wit and wisdom in cyberspace, in books, at conferences, and to packed audiences of appreciative students in high school auditoriums across the country. This modern self-help guru is sweeping the nation, dishing out advice with an attitude on his popular video podcast at www.HeyJosh.tv. Listen to him for just a few minutes and you will get it, too. He counsels teenagers on everything they care about, and it's all done in a youth-friendly, humorous tone that is more hilarious survival guide than preachy sermon. Although Josh is still in his early 20s, you wouldn't know it from his résumé. He's written books, shared the stage with Bill Cosby, and hosted a reality TV show. For the past seven years, this San Francisco Bay-Area resident has toured the world as a successful motivational speaker sharing his message that boosts self-esteem and promotes a positive outlook on life with more than one million people.

John Kevin Hines is a speaker for the National Mental Health Awareness Campaign's Speakers' Bureau, the Heard. During the past five years, Kevin has spoken to more than 150,000 people about his experiences and reached millions in media interviews. He was featured in the film *The Bridge* and also appeared in *People*, *Time*, and *Newsweek* magazines and shared his story on *Larry King Live*, *Prime Time*, *Anderson Cooper 360°*, *20/20*, and many other national news programs. Kevin's devotion to living every single day grounded to the things he loves comes through loud and clear; he is truly an inspiration.

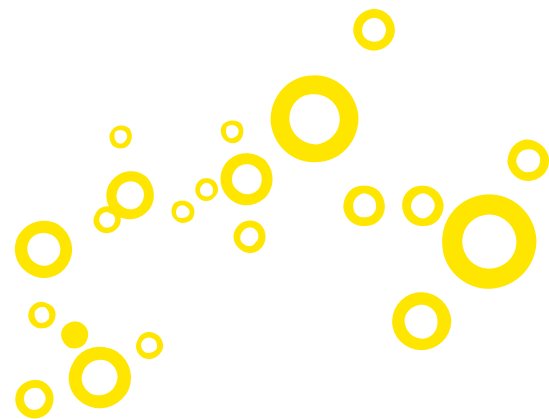

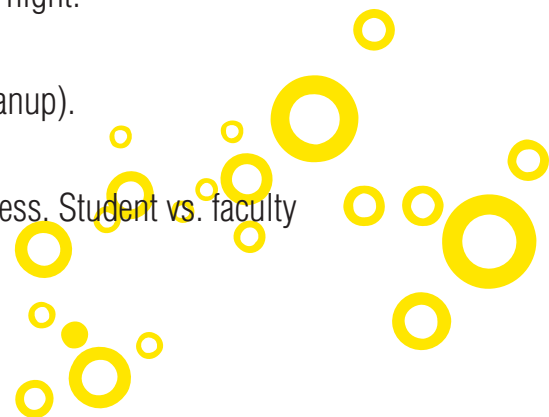


Fund-Raising Ideas and Tips

Be sure to get your principal's permission before hosting a fund-raising event at your school.

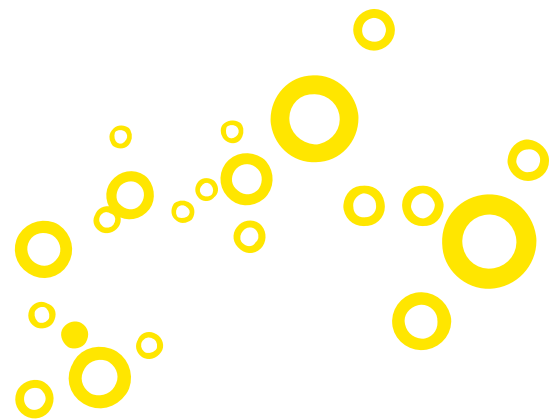
#1 Tip: Always explain to adults what the fund-raiser/event is for and even suggest that an additional contribution (beyond the cost of the car wash, for example) would be greatly appreciated. You might want to have a jar or basket for contributions to support the students. Many times adults will give more than the cost of the service or ticket if asked!

- Have members of your SADD chapter write personal letters asking for donations from local business people.
- Ask your fellow SADD chapter members to gather the contact information for their parents' employers and ask permission to send your contribution request letter to those contacts. You may want to make follow-up calls to these business leaders as well.
- Make Valentine's Day cards and sell them. Design a few cards, make an order form, send to schoolmates with an explanation of what the money is being raised for, fill the orders, and collect the money.
- Ask your local pharmacy or grocery store if you can place a jar at the register. People really do contribute! Choose a place that doesn't have a tip jar for employees – you don't want to compete with your classmates.
- Organize an Orange Crush sale. Students can send an Orange Crush with a note to their "Crush" for \$1. Recipients can then pay a \$1 to find out who has a crush on them.
- Participate in the Boston Market "Time for Your School" fund-raising program. Visit sadd.org for more information.
- Ask local companies for a donated item (MP3 player, Discman, digital camera, set of movie passes, \$50 worth of pizza for a party, etc.) and sell raffle tickets for \$1.
- Think food: bake sales, ice cream sundae sales, popcorn sales, hot dog sales, etc.
- Partner with other clubs and organizations and sponsor a "Battle of the Bands" at your school.
- Host a car (or dog) wash, spaghetti dinner, school dance, or movie night.
- Conduct a community bottle/can recycling drive.
- Hold a student services auction (babysitting, typing, yard work/cleanup).
- Offer face painting at the local mall or grocery store.
- Have a contest during the regular school day – during lunch or recess. Student vs. faculty



sports contests, team spelling bees, or faculty baby picture identification contests are fun events to sponsor.

- Host a local sporting event. These events will generate the most funds if they are held on a Friday night or a Saturday, when family members are more likely to attend and when students are looking for something fun to do.
- Charge people to participate in a mural painting activity.

Spirit Stick

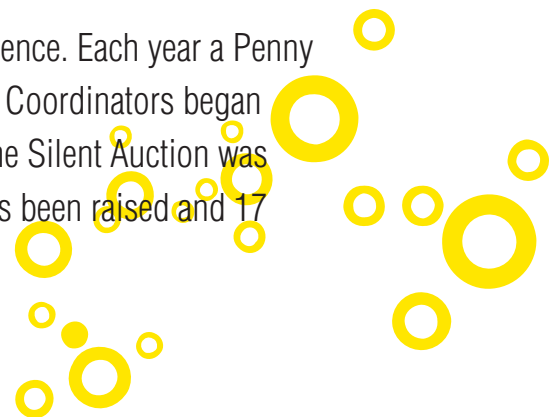

scholarships have been awarded. Students can help continue this program by participating in the Penny Drive and adults can bid at the Silent Auction event during conference.

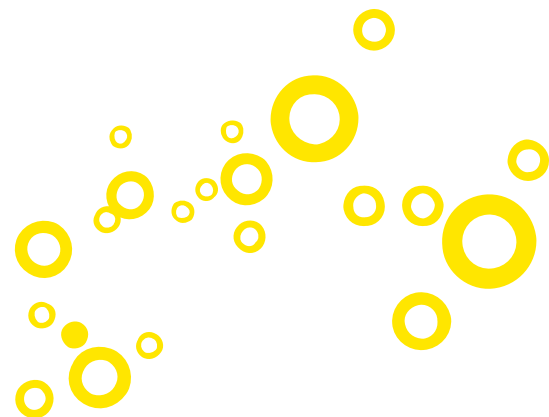
- **The SLC Wants Your Jingle, Jangle, Jingle**

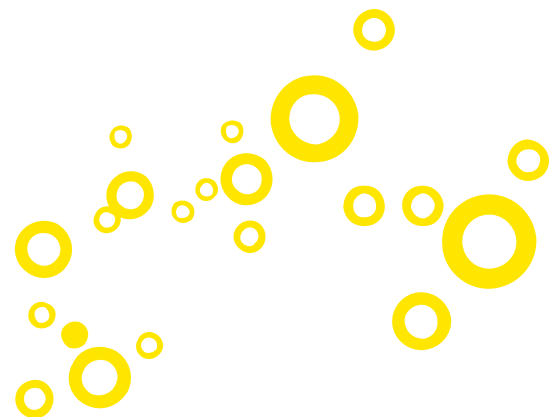

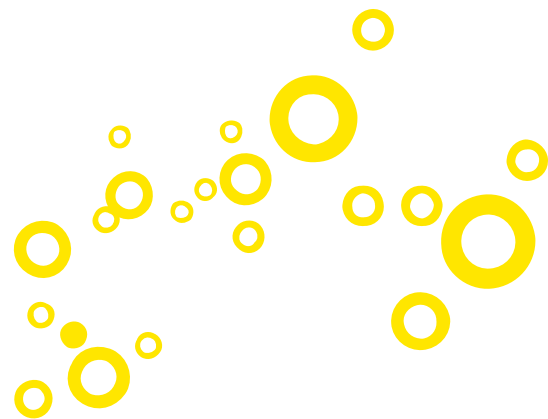

2008 SADD National Conference Registration

The SADD National Conference is structured to offer a single all-inclusive price for four days of education, entertainment, and excitement. The Ground Package price represents a valuable offer for the once-in-a-lifetime experiences available to SADD students and advisors who attend this conference. **SADD National will guarantee a Ground Package subsidy to every SADD student and adult who registers and provides full payment for the SADD National Conference by the Final Payment Deadline Date of April 15.** WorldStrides also offers an optional Air Package, including valuable services, to conference attendees. **SADD National will offer an additional subsidy to all adults and students who purchase and pay for an Air Package through WorldStrides by the Final Payment Date.** Please see pricing and details of each package below.

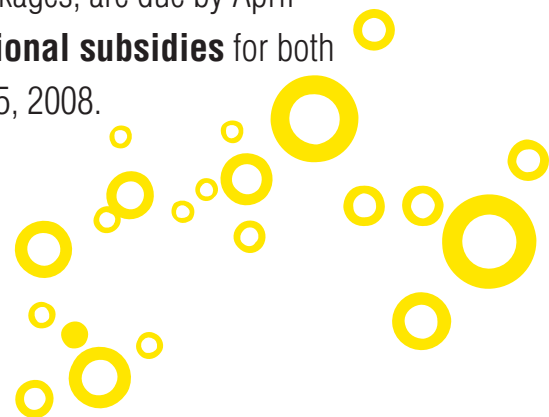
There are two important deadlines in registering for this conference.

Group Registration Deadline: March 21, 2008

All groups, regardless of size, are required to complete and submit a Group Registration Form along with a \$100 *per person nonrefundable* deposit by the Group Registration Deadline of March 21. If we do not fill up by March 21, registrations received after that date will be subject to a \$35 per person late fee.

Final Payment & Subsidy Award Deadline: April 15, 2008

Full payment for all registrations, including both Ground and Air Packages, are due by April 15. **April 15 is also the deadline for award of the SADD National subsidies** for both Ground and Air Packages. No subsidies will be awarded after April 15, 2008.



As space allows, attendees wishing to register after April 15 must have full payment with their registration, including the \$35 late registration fee per person.

Ground Package Components


The full price of the Ground Package will be \$772.00 for a student and \$877.00 for an adult. The **SADD National subsidy price for those who register and pay by the final deadline of April 15 will be \$672.00 for a student and \$727.00 for an adult.** The Ground Package includes the following.

- Conference registration fees
- Four days of conference speakers, workshops, activities, and materials
- Three nights' lodging at The **Wigwam Golf Resort & Spa** in Phoenix, Arizona
- All meals from dinner Sunday, June 22, through breakfast on Wednesday, June 25
- A "Dive-In Movie" at The Wigwam pool on Sunday evening
- An off-site trip to **Rawhide**, an authentic 1880s Western town and entertainment park, including Dinner and Event Pass
- A closing Awards Banquet and dance at The Wigwam on Tuesday night
- WorldStrides night chaperones (security) at the hotel on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday nights

- Meet and greet service for your group on arrival Sunday, June 22, 2008
- Charter bus transportation from Phoenix Sky Harbor airport to The Wigwam Golf Resort & Spa upon arrival June 22, 2008.
- Charter bus transportation to Phoenix Sky Harbor airport for departure on Wednesday, June 25, 2008

Transportation between the airport and the hotel before or after June 22-25 is the responsibility of the conference attendee.

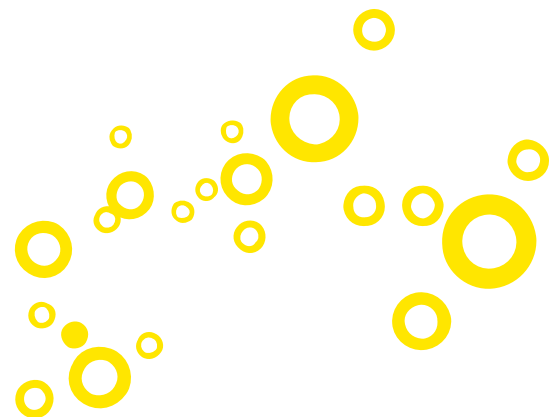
Group Registration Deadline: March 21, 2008

A nonrefundable deposit of \$100 per person must accompany each Group Registration Form. You will receive written confirmation of your registration along with an invoice for final payment.

Final Payment & Subsidy Award Deadline: April 15, 2008

Final payments not received by April 15, 2008, may result in registration cancellation. As space allows, attendees wishing to register after April 15 must have full payment with their registration, including the \$35 late registration fee per person.

SADD National subsidies are available only to those who register and pay in full by April 15, 2008.



Guidelines for Booking Flights Through WorldStrides

Please read through these guidelines carefully and then proceed to www.worldstrides.com/SADD to begin the registration process.

When booking a flight through WorldStrides, the following conditions apply.

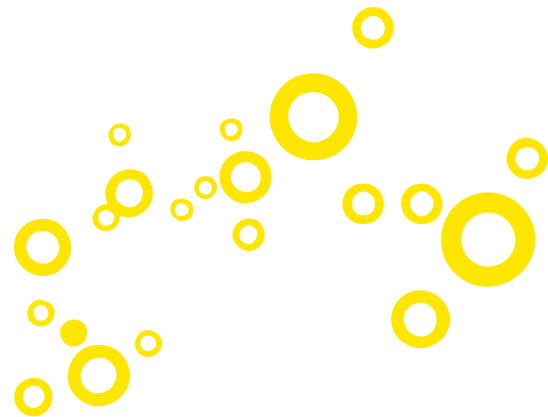
- An **Air Pricing Request Form** must be submitted to WorldStrides no later than April 1, 2008.
- Flights are reserved only when the Air Pricing Request Form is processed and a \$100 per person nonrefundable deposit is received.
- WorldStrides will provide a schedule and fare quote by e-mail to individuals and groups who request assistance. Groups of 10 or more and those who are flying out of major airports are likely to receive better fares, so conference attendees may wish to arrange travel with other SADD groups.
- For groups of 10 or more, WorldStrides airfares will be guaranteed until 68 days prior to the conference (April 15, 2008). Airfares quoted for groups of 10 or more may be subject to increase if less than 10 travelers actually book flights or if registrations are received later than April 15, 2008.
- For individuals and groups of less than 10, WorldStrides will provide a schedule and fare quote by e-mail. The individual or group will have **one business day to respond**. If the individual or group fails to respond by the given time, the quote will be considered null and void.
- Once issued, all tickets are nonrefundable and nontransferable. No changes are permitted.
- All airfares booked through WorldStrides by the Final Payment Deadline Date of April 15 are eligible for a \$100 subsidy from SADD National. This air subsidy is in addition to the subsidy that applies to Ground Packages.
- Attendees who do not wish to book their flights through WorldStrides may purchase a Ground Package and make their own travel arrangements. SADD National will not provide air subsidies to those who do not book airfares through WorldStrides.
- Those who book their own airfares are responsible for transfers between the airport and the hotel in Phoenix.
- No subsidies for Ground or Air packages will be available after April 15, 2008; Ground and Air Packages will then revert to full price.

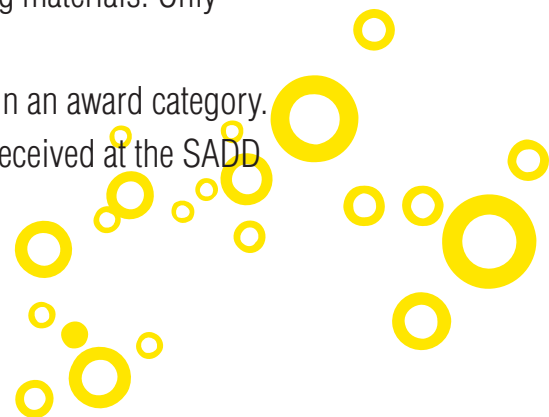

Eligibility Requirements:

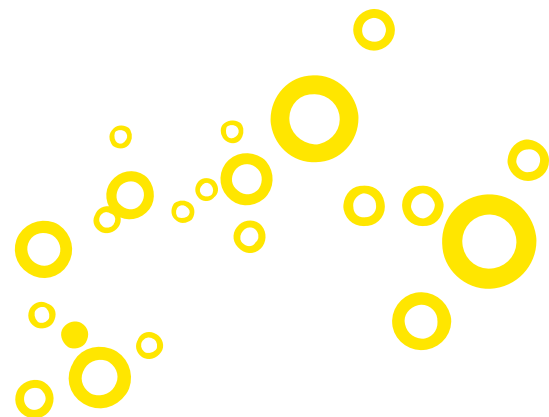
1. Nominations must be related to work supporting the SADD mission between April 1, 2007, and April 1, 2008.

Activity of the Year

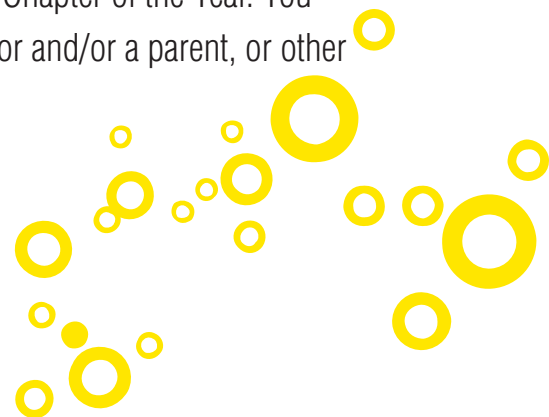

Judges will consider the following qualities, among others: innovation, creativity, reach, effectiveness, and collaboration. In your nomination, provide a detailed written summary of the activity, including its name, goal or purpose, date(s) when the activity was held, target audience, number of people affected and how, any costs associated with its implementation, and any resulting media coverage. You may include a letter of support from a school administrator and/or partner as well as other supporting materials.

Advisor of the Year

This award will be presented to the individual who is considered the most outstanding SADD advisor. Include the reasons why you think your advisor is the best, share his or her passion for SADD, and provide examples to support your nomination. Please be sure to include the full name, home address, telephone number, and e-mail address for the advisor and the length of time he or she has served as a SADD advisor as well as information about students in your chapter.

Chapter of the Year

This award will be presented to the best SADD chapter. What qualities define a chapter as the best? There can be many different traits. Tell us why you think your chapter is the best and provide backup materials to support your nomination. On the nomination form, be sure to include the name of your chapter and your school (including the address), your advisor's name and contact information, a brief history of your chapter, and details about its activities over the past school year, including why you think it should be recognized as Chapter of the Year. You may include news clips, a letter of support from a school administrator and/or a parent, or other supporting materials.

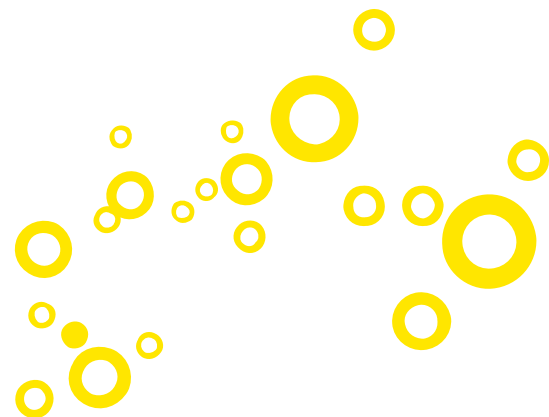


RECOGNITION OPPORTUNITIES
